Morris and Jones reminded those who have been appointed by the Board of Selectpersons but not sworn in to go to the town clerk's office and get sworn in.

• Selection and election of Secretary and Treasurer

With not enough sworn-in members in attendance, we put off the selection and election of officer positions for secretary and treasurer until the July 24 meeting

Discuss branding look and designer proposals

Chair Morris said he put out a request on social media and via email to area designers to submit a proposal to produce a logo and to design marketing material for the committee through the duration of the commemoration period. We received two proposals. A subcommittee led by Daniela Sikora is being formed to review the submissions and collect more submissions for further review at the July 24 meeting

Website look and manager

Committee member Renee Brown-Cheng offered to take the lead on the website creation, build, and ongoing maintenance. Morris suggested we secure a domain name and proposed ridgefield250.org and ridgefield1776.org. Some people thought ridgefield250 was good but others thought it was confusing to people who recall the town's 300th-anniversary celebration in 2008, not knowing that this is about America's

declaration of independence in 1776. Some thought ridgefield1776.org seemed dated and not clear. Further discussion at the July 24 meeting.

 Coordinating working relationship Arts Council – August evening social/brainstorming event

Morris and Daniela Sikora both stressed the importance of maintaining a strong line of communication with the arts and cultural community, many of whom have begun planning activities for this commemoration. Morris suggested a social event in August at Keeler Tavern. Dates to come and to be decided via email. The idea of the event is to open lines of communication and to share what decisions the committee has made to date and to share any logo concepts that are in the works.

Brainstorm ideas: events, activities, programs, fund-raisers...

Each member of the committee shared ideas on what he or she would like to take place during the commemorative period of July 4, 2025, to July 6, 2026 (tentative); Ideas included but do not total: a parade, a townwide bbq/community event, Patriot run, Liberty Ball, reading of the Declaration of Independence, Choral event, commissioned song, tree-planting competition, Museum in the Street installation, and more
