Dear Neighbor:

We have had a very busy year. These are just some of our important accomplishments:

- **Declaration of Open Space** After several years of research, we identified and protected in perpetuity about 1,200 acres of 100 Town-owned open space parcels ensuring that they would forever remain undeveloped.
- Natural Resource Inventory Update We are updating the NRI for the Town. As part of this project, we provide citizen science opportunities for Ridgefielders and bring WestConn students and faculty in as volunteers.
- Open Space Acquisition We acquired several parcels of open space. The largest was that of the 52-acre former Boy Scout property at Pine Mountain, where we are developing a series of new trails.
- Native Plant Policy We prepared a Town Policy requiring that all new plantings on Town property be native species in our efforts to control the spread of invasive species. Our web site includes a list of native plants to consider.
- Trail Maintenance and Storm Cleanup With reports from our Ridgefield Rangers, we were able to find and clear many dead and fallen trees, and repair damaged bridges and bog walkways.
- McKeon Farm We installed several thousand feet of new fencing around the property and removed 1,000 feet of invasive plants along the stone walls. The farming methods used by Henny Penny Farm have improved the condition of those pastures grazed by the sheep, thus improving biodiversity in the soil, flora, and fauna.
- **Bird Watching** We hosted several bird walks; most recently, a weekend of raptor counting was conducted at Ridgefield High School where spectacular numbers of raptors were seen flying overhead.
