The Town of Ridgefield has been undergoing a town-wide assessment as required by the American's with Disabilities Act (ADA), which is being conducted by the Institute for Human Centered Design (IHCD). Now in its final stages, it will soon be completed resulting in a document known as a *transition list*, which lists any shortcomings that need to be addressed. The plan is then to prioritize remedial solutions and commence action.

This project has been a priority for the Commission for Accessibility (formerly Commission for the Disabled) for many years. The Board of Selectman (BOS) has been enthusiastic in responsive to this project from the beginning and as a farsighted measure included the schools in this project.

The purpose of the study is to identify barriers to accessibility in town and school facilities and programs and record them on the transition list. The first step will be to prioritize the items on the list in a critical order for remediation. By the time the list is published, a number of the items may have already been fixed and can be marked as such. Other items may be able to be resolved by in-house maintenance that can be scheduled in the normal course of town business. Those items left may require outside contractors, which will require a going through a bidding and budgetary process.

Since the ADA recognizes it may not be possible to address all these items immediately, it allows the town to set a timetable for compliance. All items must be given an estimated date for completion. The ADA also takes into consideration that towns may have plans to replace a facility within a certain time frame that

will satisfy the requirements of this Act provided efforts to remove barriers continue in the meantime.

For the information of the public, the ADA is a complaint- based law enforced by the United States Department of Justice (DOJ). Sometimes, it seems this is merely a zoning or building code regulation, but it is actually a *civil rights law*. It has always been the opinion of the Commission the town is in fundamental compliance and has been pro-active in its efforts to promote accessibility.
