RE: CT OPM TOD Grant Program

On June 28 the CT Office of Policy and Management (OPM) announced a Request for Applications (RFA) for the 2022 Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) Grant Program. Municipalities are invited to apply for grants ranging between \$200,000 and \$2,000,000, for a wide range of planning and construction projects to advance State, regional, and local goals for transit-oriented development. This program provides grants for shovel-ready capital projects located within one-half (1/2) mile of existing public transportation facilities including rail, bus rapid transit (BRT) and/or a high-frequency, seven day per week local transit stop. The municipality must either own the property or hold a long-term lease on the property.

Shovel-ready capital projects or certain activities to directly support such projects, including but not limited to the following:

- new construction, expansion, renovation, or replacement of existing facility/facilities
- site improvements to support an eligible capital project
- upgrades to existing public infrastructure to support an eligible capital project
- land acquisition in support of an eligible capital project

Please note that preference will be given to shovel-ready projects that include a minimum 20% match of the total project cost.

Interested applicants must meet the project eligibility requirements as detailed in the <u>RFA</u> and submit a completed <u>Application Form</u> directly to OPM. Applications will be evaluated by OPM, in consultation with other agencies, and awards will be made at the discretion of the OPM Secretary and subject to availability of funding approved by the Bond Commission.

RE: Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program

On June 29 the US Department of Transportation announced the release of the FFY 2022 Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program (RCP). Under this Program, grant funds are to be awarded on a competitive basis for projects that reconnect communities by removing, retrofitting, or mitigating highways or other transportation facilities that create barriers to community connectivity, including to mobility, access, or economic development. The variety of transformative solutions to reconnect communities can include public transportation, infrastructure removal, pedestrian walkways and overpasses, capping highways, linear parks and trail connectors, roadway redesigns and Complete Streets conversions, and main street revitalization projects.

Eligible applicants for RCP planning grants are states, Metropolitan Planning Organizations, Federally recognized Tribal Governments, units of local government, and nonprofit organizations. Eligible applicants for RCP capital construction grants are owners of the transportation facility. Facility owners may submit joint applications with those entities eligible for planning grants.

Up to \$195 million is available to for competitive grants through the RCP Program in FY 2022 (\$50 million is dedicated to planning grants and \$145 million is dedicated to capital construction grants). The Program Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) is available at https://www.transportation.gov/sites/dot.gov/files/2022-06/RCP_NOFO_FY22.pdf. The RCP Program grant applications are due on October 13, 2022 and must be submitted through grants.gov. Award winners are expected to be announced in early 2023.

Preference will be given to applications serving economically disadvantaged communities, especially applications that address equity and environmental justice, have strong community engagement and stewardship, and a commitment to shared prosperity and local workforce development.

Due to USDOT's emphasis on larger-scale, regional and multi-jurisdictional projects, WestCOG will be coordinating a meeting with MPO members to develop a competitive and regional application.

WestCOG encourages its member communities to review the NOFO and to consider projects that may fulfill the RCP's goals. If your municipality is interested in applying to this program, please let Todd Fontanella know. Thanks!

The Regional Transportation Safety Plan (RTSP) was endorsed June 17, 2021 in order to reduce fatalities and injuries by outlining effective safety countermeasures to reduce potential future crashes. The RTSP serves as a road map and strategy to save lives, as well as an Action Plan under Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Discretionary Grant Opportunity. This addendum provides additional information to clarify the engagement and analysis that was completed during the RTSP planning process.

Engagement

Municipal representatives were charged with overseeing the RTSPs development. This can be found in *Appendix A: Municipal Reports* of the plan. At the October 8, 2019 meeting a kick-off presentation was provided to the TAG with an opportunity for public participation. Over the course of 2019 and 2020, WestCOG and the consultants held discussions with municipal staff members to review the data analysis and discuss the site visit(s) taking place within the municipality. A public comment period was held from March 30, 2021 to May 7, 2021 to review the draft RTSP. The draft plan was posted on the WestCOG website and made publicly available. The draft was also presented at the April 13, 2021 TAG and April 22, 2021 MPO meetings with an opportunity for public participation. WestCOG received 4 comments on the plan; after review and incorporation the final version was endorsed at the June 17, 2021 HVMPO and SWRMPO meetings.

Analysis

At the July 21, 2022 meetings of the Housatonic Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization (HVMPO) and South Western Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (SWRMPO) the MPOs committed to an eventual goal of zero highway fatalities and serious injuries via resolution endorsement. This resolution re-affirmed CTDOT's annual Safety Targets to achieve significant declines in highway fatalities and serious injuries. The voting members committed to achieve an 80% reduction in highway fatalities and serious injuries over the next 25 years. WestCOG will measure this reduction by monitoring the outcome data of fatalities and serious injuries in the Region through the UConn Crash Repository.
